

- Micro, small and medium-sized enterprises (MSMEs) comprise 94 per cent of industrial firms in the OECD
- But account for only 36 per cent of exports and 41 per cent of imports
- MSMEs have slightly increased their share of trade since 2016 (up from 34 per cent of exports and 38 per cent of imports in the 2016 World trade report
- Large variability across economies smaller economies (e.g., Cyprus, Latvia and Estonia) report larger shares of MSME exports




Despite their relatively small shares in the US dollar value of exports and imports, MSMEs represent the majority of trading firms in every developed economies

Trade by sector varies substantially. Developed economy MSMEs import more services than any other economic sector; however, when it comes to exports, the value generated by MSMEs exporting manufactured goods and services is split almost evenly





- World Bank Enterprise Survey (WBES) data from 2016-2021
- SMEs in developing economies and LDCs are primarily engaged in domestic sales rather than exports
- But roughly one third of inputs are imported (higher backward GVC links)
- SMEs in developing economies report higher participation in upstream less technology-intensive sectors.





- To address climate change, businesses of all sizes will need to contribute to decarbonization efforts by reducing behaviors harmful to the climate and environment and by engaging in sustainable practices.
- Survey data from 30 economies gathered by Meta
- MSMEs are concerned about climate change and their impact on supply chains
- But these firms need additional knowledge for how to make changes and they are worried about the impacts on operating costs

FEMALE AND MALE RESPONDENTS REPORTED SIMILAR SHARES OF CLIMATE CONCERN FOR THEIR BUSINESS, BUT WOMEN ARE MORE LIKELY TO BE UNFAMILIAR WITH THE IMPACTS OF CLIMATE CHANGE.



Question: What are the most significant barriers you are facing regarding carbon reduction?


